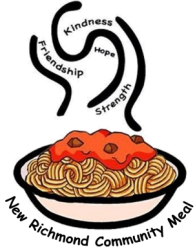
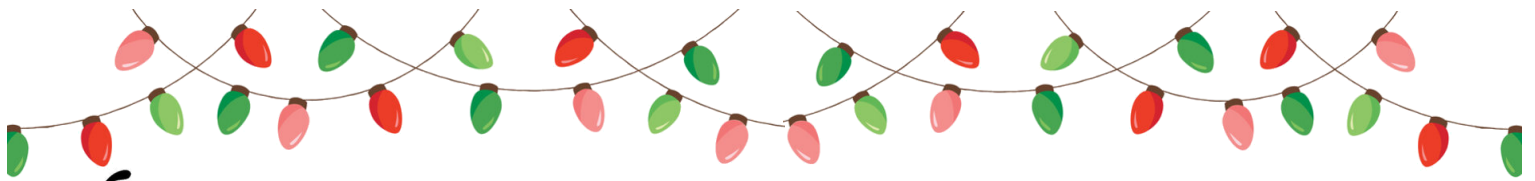

The UMC Piece Corps Quilters is a small-but-mighty group of volunteers from our church that make beautiful quilts that are donated to Westfields Hospital and Grace Place Transitional Shelter.

Quilts donated to Westfields Hospital, "Dignity Quilts", are used by the staff and carefully draped over the hospital transport stretcher of recently deceased patients before they are moved from their room and transported to the morgue or funeral home. This compassionate long-standing practice provides honor to the deceased and comfort to loved-ones, family members and hospital staff at an especially vulnerable and raw time of grief and loss. The quilts provide meaning and honor for surviving family members and symbolize the compassion and caring that we have for one another.

At Grace Place transitional shelter, the quilts are given to people staying at the shelter, to people passing through and to people as they move out of the shelter onto their next stage of life.

Piece Corps relies solely on donations from our congregation and the community. Most of the fabric they use is donated from people in our community. Some expenses they have include batting and the occasional purchase of fabric. If you have fabric at home that you would like to donate, please contact Carolyn Craig or Laurel Olson to see if it's something that they can use. If you would like to make a monetary donation to the group, please see Kristi in the church office or simply put your donation in the offering basket on Sundays (marked "Piece Corps"). What is Ruby's Pantry? Ruby's Pantry is a simple yet powerful idea: more than 170 generous companies donate food and household items, and Ruby's Pantry helps get those items into the hands of communities through monthly "pop-up pantry" events.

Everyone is welcome! No income or residency requirements. If you eat, you qualify!

For a \$25 donation, guests receive a generous bundle of groceries called a "share". Ruby's Pantry is a faith-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit that receives no government funding. Your donation helps cover essential costs like transportation, fuel, warehouse staff, and logistics—ensuring that this ministry can continue to bless families across Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota, and Iowa. No one is turned away due to an inability to donate.

End to our 11am Sunday Worship Service

Dear NR UMC Members and Friends,

After consulting with regular attendees of our 11:00am worship service and the Worship Design Team, the Worship Design Team has decided that beginning Sunday, November 30th, we will go back to worshipping at one service on Sundays, at 9:00am only.

The 11am worship service had declining attendance into the single digits last spring, mostly because people said they really missed seeing people they knew, so they began attending the 9am worship service again.

Visitors who attend the 11am worship service with such low attendance, rarely return. The Worship Design Team decided to try again this fall, with a slightly different timeline, but the attendance, except for one of the Sundays, was even smaller than in the spring.

In order to best use our resources and energy, we have decided to focus on one worship service instead of running an 11am worship service all the way through Easter.

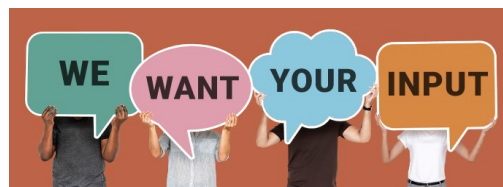
While we know this may disappoint some, we also heard from 11am worship attendees that they are not surprised by the idea and most of them intend to simply attend at 9am.

With the help of over 750 stores/brands, it turns our everyday shopping into earnings for our church. Not only can you use Scrip cards for your personal every day purchases, but they also make great gifts! Many of the cards are re-loadable too, like Kwik Trip! Don't have a computer or want to shop online? Contact Kristi in the church office (715-246-2464) or our Organist, Mary Jensen (715-222-0586) and they can place your order for you! It's super easy and not additional cost to you.

Every store/brand gives a rebate percentage- normally between 2% and 16%, and they often run specials for even more! The rebate amount comes directly to our church when a card is purchased at its face value. For instance, if you order a \$100 card and the rebate on it is 4%, the church receives \$4 and you still receive the card for its face value of \$100. It's a Win-Win! It's easy, it's rewarding, and it fits perfectly into your busy lifestyle.

Instant Access to eGift Cards

In addition to physical gift cards, ShopWithScrip offers ScripNow® eGift cards for over 400 brands. eGift cards are perfect for last-minute or unplanned purchases, like dining out or a quick trip to the mall. You have access to the scrip you need whenever you need it. Place your eGift card order on ShopWithScrip.com or on MyScripWallet.com on your mobile device. When you pay for your eGift cards with online payments (credit card or a linked bank account), you'll receive the eGift cards immediately. All of your eGift cards are housed in your wallet on ShopWithScrip and on your phone in MyScripWallet. You can print eGift cards and present them like a physical gift card in the store or redeem them from MyScripWallet. Redeem them online by entering the card number and PIN when you're checking out. You can also send a ScripNow eGift. It's easy to customize the eGift with a personal note, and send it to anyone, anywhere, with an email address. Our eGift card selection is growing all the time.
