### for the WI UM Conference Ingathering

The WI Conference Mission Motivation Committee will again be collecting items for Midwest Mission at our WI Annual Conference, held in June. Starting in April, Robin Reichert from our NR UMC Mission Team will be organizing the collection of Dignity Kits as part of this mission project.

The Midwest Distribution Center distributes the kits locally, nationally, and internationally to those in need during times of crisis. All supplies are given out free of charge regardless of gender, race, or religion. Midwest Mission is one of eight cooperating depots in the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Supply Network. Midwest Mission distributes UMCOR supplies in response to disasters within the United States. The kits will include:

#### **Personal Dignity Kit Items:**

- 1 Bath Hand Towel (No kitchen towels)
- 1 Bath Washcloth (No dishcloths)
- 1 Adult Toothbrush (No multi-packs or electric)
- 1 Bar Soap (3 4 oz.)
- 1 Shampoo (12 19 oz.)
- 1 Deodorant (2-3 oz. stick, roll on, or pump)
- 1 Lotion (8-10 oz.)
- 1 1-gal Re-sealable Plastic Bag



<u>All items should be NEW</u> – and all kits should have only the items requested. Please place items in a 1 gallon re-sealable plastic bag and return to the church by Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup>. We are also collecting monetary donations – we will need to send \$2 with each kit for the purchase of a carrying bag and toothpaste.

We hope you will join us in getting as many bags as we can together to send to the annual conference. Our goal is to send a minimum of 50. Once we're done, Pastor Jeremy will take the kits with him to Annual Conference in June. Thanks for your help with this project. Together we can accomplish great things!
