## Missional Church Consultation Initiative (MCCI) Update

We are well on our way as we capture God’s momentum for our congregation with our MCCI Prescription Teams. What a breakthrough that our Church Council unanimously adopted the Signature Ministry of becoming “The Church that Feeds People” and as part of that, sponsoring Ruby’s Pantry. Be praying about how you can be involved, there will be ways for people of all ages and abilities to be involved! Intergenerational Events are happening and making a difference across age groups, especially with the summer potlucks. The Financial Capacity Team met recently and is making plans for the next year. The Breakthrough Prayer Team led a third congregation-wide prayer walk and is helping us pray with bookmarks and prayer trackers (available in the narthex). The fuel for our movement now continues to be our breakthrough prayer, so take a moment now to pray it. 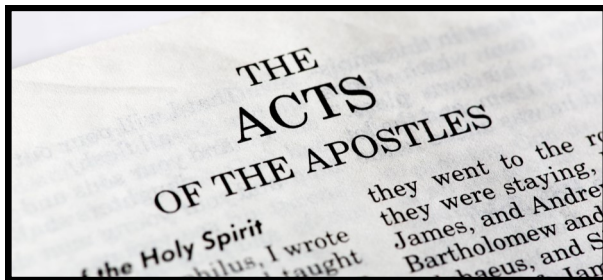

Dear Members and Friends of NR UMC,

We are on a new adventure with God and our community! At the August 19, 2025 Church Council meeting, your Church Council voted unanimously for the following motion:

“We move to adopt the Signature Ministry Team’s proposal that our church become “The Church that Feeds People” and adopts the sponsorship of Ruby’s Pantry as part of this mission.”

This is an exciting time for us as a congregation, following up on years of prayer and breakthroughs! Feeding people is in our DNA as a church. From the Christmas Day meal to the Community Meal for Everyone, to significant support for Five Loaves Food Shelf, to fundraising for mission with food left and right, to something akin to Ruby’s Pantry that we hosted a while back called “Fair Share,” New Richmond United Methodist Church really is, and will now lean further into being, “The Church that Feeds People.” Not only that, we can align other ministries into ways that we offer spiritual food, so that feeding people is also a way to grow in love with God and neighbor.

Ruby’s Pantry will be sponsored by us but is really a community-wide effort. They require a church to sponsor the monthly food distribution, but volunteers will come from all over the community. The event will be held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month at the Armory, which is already supplied for a New Richmond site of Ruby’s Pantry. More than 150 companies donate food and household products, which are then trucked to our site. Guests come and can buy a share of food for \$25. Purchasing a share of food is something that anyone and everyone in the community can do. Also, nobody is turned away if they can’t pay for a share. Food that is left over is returned to Ruby’s for the first three months so they can get a sense of how much we need. After that, we can distribute leftover food to other people who need it, including to other organizations such as Five Loaves Food Shelf with whom we hope to work closely. The need is great. Ruby’s Pantry expects that the New Richmond site will continue to have 250-300 shares distributed each month.

There is a way for everyone to be involved! We need people to pray. We need people to spread the word. We need people to share about this ministry with their community groups. We need people to invite others around New Richmond to volunteer. We need volunteers and leaders. No matter your age or ability, you can find a way to get involved that makes your heart sing.

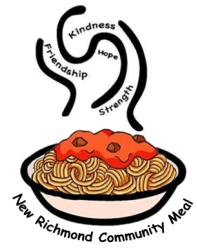
In our Missional Church Consultation Initiative (MCCI) resourcing we defined a Godspring Moment as a push, pull or nudge of spiritual momentum that leads us to make a new or renewed spiritual decision. And I think we are having a Godspring Moment as a church right now! God is breaking through and inviting us toward the next thing. It’s a thing we are used to doing, feeding people. And it’s a new way of engaging with our DNA of feeding people. It will allow us, as our MCCI prescription says, to “connect with and serve a significant need” in our community. It’s a way that we at NR UMC can become known and can involve “new invitational relationships” with people who may not have a connection to a community of faith.

I look forward to going on this journey of being “The Church that Feeds People” with you. Together, and with the help of God and our community, I believe we will be amazed at how God will feed us and how we will feed each other. Let’s see what new possibilities God has in store for us!

The UMC Piece Corps Quilters is a small-but-mighty group of volunteers from our church that make beautiful quilts that are donated to Westfields Hospital and Grace Place Transitional Shelter.

Quilts donated to Westfields Hospital, "Dignity Quilts", are used by the staff and carefully draped over the hospital transport stretcher of recently deceased patients before they are moved from their room and transported to the morgue or funeral home. This compassionate long-standing practice provides honor to the deceased and comfort to loved-ones, family members and hospital staff at an especially vulnerable and raw time of grief and loss. The quilts provide meaning and honor for surviving family members and symbolize the compassion and caring that we have for one another.

At Grace Place transitional shelter, the quilts are given to people staying at the shelter, to people passing through and to people as they move out of the shelter onto their next stage of life.

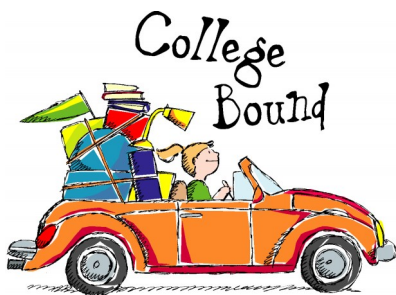

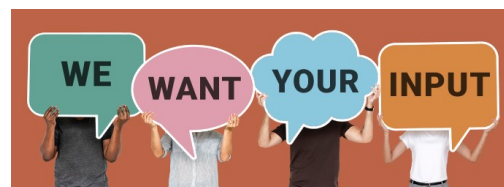
## Recycle Your Ink Cartridges at Church!
